Student Discipline Policy

The following policy has been extracted and reorganized from the current Parent and Student Handbooks. It reflects the discipline-related policies presently adopted by Mumineen Academy.

Philosophy

Members of the Mumineen Academy community are expected to model Islamic behavior while on campus and during school-sponsored activities. The school promotes Islamic Behavior, Respect, Resourcefulness, Reliability, and Resilience. Teachers, staff, and fellow students are to be treated with respect. Infringing on the rights of others will not be tolerated and may result in a parent/guardian conference, detention, and/or suspension.

Student Expectations

- Demonstrate Islamic behavior and good manners.
- Treat teachers, staff, visitors, and fellow students with respect.
- Serve as positive role models for peers.
- Follow classroom, assembly, and school event expectations.
- Respect school property and maintain a clean campus.
- Use technology and electronic devices responsibly.

Progressive Discipline for Classroom Misconduct

Offense	Response
First	Teacher warns the student.
Second	Teacher communicates with parent/guardian and completes a Notice of Concern form.
Third	Teacher assigns detention and notifies the parent/guardian.
Fourth & Beyond	Teacher issues a referral to administration and the student may be assigned an additional consequence.

Academic Honesty

Academic dishonesty is addressed as follows:

- First Offense: Grade of zero, parent notification, documentation, and possible conference.
- Second Offense: Failure of the class for the grading period (maximum grade of 69%).
- Third Offense: Administrative conference with recommendation for placement in another school and grade of zero for the quarter.

Bullying

Bullying, including cyberbullying, will not be tolerated. Students who believe they are victims of bullying should immediately notify a staff member. Bullying includes teasing, intimidation, threats, stalking, physical violence, theft, harassment, public humiliation, and destruction of property.

Vandalism and School Property

Students are expected to care for school property. Vandalism, including damaging school equipment, furniture, books, lockers, gates, or other property, may result in suspension or expulsion.

Technology and Electronic Devices

- Cell phones and personal electronic devices must remain powered off and stored in backpacks during the school day except under direct teacher supervision.
- Tampering with school technology equipment, hardware, or software is considered a serious breach of discipline.

Participation in School Activities

Administration may restrict participation in field trips, sporting events, or other school activities based on attendance, academic standing, or multiple disciplinary actions.

Administrative Authority

Administration reserves the authority to determine appropriate disciplinary consequences consistent with the school's published handbook and the circumstances of each incident.
